

PAYMENT & ATTENDANCE

MEMBERSHIP FEE

Band Club fees are payable in advance for a block of 10 sessions, at a cost of £87.50.

On payment, you will receive 10 credits, each covering one weekly session. If there are any weeks when sessions will not take place (e.g. Christmas) advance notice will always be given.

JOINING MID-MONTH

If you join part-way through a Band Club term, we'll adjust your first payment pro rata. From the next term, the regular £87.50 per 10 sessions applies.

MISSED SESSIONS

If your child is unable to attend a session, you must provide at least 24 hours' notice. With sufficient notice, the missed session will not be lost - instead, the credit can be used towards a future Band Club session within in the next term.

If less than 24 hours' notice is given, or no notice is provided, the session credit will be forfeited.

Credits are non-transferable and must be used within the following Band Club term.

HOW TO PAY

Payments will be made through our secure payment link two weeks before the first session of each term. You will recieve a payment link prior to the start of each term. No cash handling on the day — more time for music!



BEHAVIOUR AND ADDITIONAL SUPPORT

At Future Yard, we are committed to delivering safe, inclusive, and engaging sessions for all young people taking part in our programmes. This policy sets out our expectations around behaviour and outlines our approach to supporting children with additional behavioural or emotional needs.

OUR VALUES AND EXPECTATIONS

We aim to create a positive environment where all young people:

- Feel welcome, valued, and respected;
- Can participate fully and confidently;
- Are supported to develop creatively and socially.

To support this, we ask all young people to:

- Treat others including staff and peers with respect and kindness;
- Listen to instructions to ensure everyone's safety and enjoyment;
- Take part in sessions in a way that supports a positive group atmosphere.

BEHAVIOUR POLICY FOR YOUNG PEOPLE'S ACTIVITIES

We understand that some young people may have additional behavioural or emotional needs, or require extra support to engage fully with group activities. While we are committed to inclusion, we currently do not have the capacity to provide one-to-one pastoral support in addition to delivering our sessions. If your child requires ongoing one-to-one support, or may need to take time out during a session to regulate or reset, we ask that a parent or carer remains onsite for the duration of the activity. This enables you to support your child directly if they need to step away from the session, helping us maintain a positive and consistent experience for the whole group.



BEHAVIOUR POLICY FOR YOUNG PEOPLE'S ACTIVITIES

Please note:

- This is only necessary in cases where specific needs or behaviour patterns require additional adult support;
- Our intention is always for all children to remain in and enjoy the full session;
- These measures are in place to ensure that sessions are accessible, safe, and of high quality for everyone involved. We offer a welcoming space onsite with bar facilities, free Wi-Fi, and seating, so parents and carers are welcome to stay and relax while sessions are running. We also offer food options during busy times so it may be that you wish to order lunch and enjoy the space after sessions.

COMMUNICATION AND PARTNERSHIP WITH FAMILIES

We value working closely with families to ensure that every child has the best possible experience at Future Yard. If your child has specific needs or behaviours we should be aware of, please let us know in advance so we can work with you to plan the right level of support.

This policy helps us create a positive, inclusive space where all young people can thrive creatively and socially. Thank you for your understanding and partnership.
