Role description:

Creative Practitioners at Future Yard will play a vital role in delivering high-quality, engaging and inspiring musical experiences for children and young people across our popular Mosh Tots, New Noise and schools programmes. Through performance, education and outreach, they help foster a love for music, creativity and collaboration.

By leading performances, workshops and tuition, Creative Practitioners contribute to Future Yard's mission of providing accessible and inclusive music experiences. They engage audiences of all ages, create meaningful connections and inspire the next generation of musicians.

This role is suited to adaptable and enthusiastic individuals who are passionate about music, education and community engagement, ensuring that every experience at Future Yard is both enjoyable and educational.

Due to the nature of Future Yard programmes, the scope of the Creative Practitioner role will evolve with more exciting opportunities becoming available over time.

Salary:

Pay rates are between £20-25 an hour for delivery and £12 per hour for admin, rehearsal and other requirements, such as some meetings and training etc.

Work Pattern:

Tuition sessions will be variable depending on the location and demand. Schools tuition will be between the hours of 9am and 6pm on weekdays; tuition at Future Yard will likely be between the hours of 4pm and 8pm on weekdays and weekends.

Mosh Tots band shows are Sunday morning, so availability between 9:30am and 1:30pm is essential. New Noise band performances will take place in school and at Future Yard (weekdays 9am-3pm). Band rehearsals will also be required in addition.

There is the possibility of future fixed-term opportunities being available in line with programme development.

Holidays:

28 days (pro rata) plus bank holidays.

EY RESPONSIBILITIES

Creative Practitioners are encouraged to explore and engage with a variety of roles, ensuring suitability for each individual.

Mosh Tots Band

- Mosh Tots band members perform child-friendly songs, engaging with the audience to create an inclusive, fun, and interactive experience. Between songs, they build rapport with both children and parents, making them feel welcome and comfortable in the environment.
- Beyond performing, band members introduce children to musical concepts during the show, covering topics such as music genres, musical terminology (with live examples), and fun facts about instruments.
- After the show, band members meet and interact with families to strengthen connections, gather feedback, and promote merchandise. For birthday party bookings, the band also provides 'meet & greet' sessions before and/or after the performance.
- Band members are expected to learn all content in advance and attend occasional Mosh Tots band workshops to rehearse new material as a team. They are also active in a group chat to coordinate availability, contribute to special event planning, develop themes, and create musical educational content.

New Noise Band

New Noise band members take on similar responsibilities, with a focus on engaging an older youth audience. Rather than weekly shows, performances are centered around special events.

Education + Outreach

Bands, workshop teams, and individuals will deliver Live Assemblies and Interactive Experience Days within local schools, and School Trips, and Celebration Festivals at Future Yard as part of the Future Yard x Schools Programme. Creative Practitioners may also be involved in the delivery of CPD training sessions for school staff at Future Yard.

Instrumental Tuition + Band Clubs

Lessons and band sessions take place both in schools and at Future Yard. Every tutor at Future Yard brings their own unique style and expertise, shaping the way they teach. We celebrate this individuality.

As a tutor, you:

- Deliver flexible and engaging lessons tailored to individual students.
- Track student attendance and progress with support.
- Create a space where young musicians can explore, experiment, and grow while having fun.
